COURSE DESCRIPTION

Introduction of veterinary medical terminology and abbreviations. Emphasis is placed on pronunciation and spelling of root terms, prefixes, and suffixes unique to anatomy, clinical pathology, and treatment of animals. Prerequisite: Department acceptance to the veterinary technology program.
