COURSE DESCRIPTION

Extensive study of decedent's estates with consideration to the various trust options and pre-death decisions that can be arranged. Students will draft wills and trust agreements, complete court forms, and prepare estate tax returns and fiduciary accountings. Prerequisite: LEG 110S and CIT 110S.
