COURSE DESCRIPTION

Study of the major developments, achievements, and contradictions in Greek culture from the Bronze Age to the Hellenistic Era. Prerequisite: Qualifying assessment scores in reading and writing or satisfactory completion of ENG 091D and ENG 093D.
