COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course provides paramedic candidates with the knowledge and skills to integrate assessment findings with principles of epidemiology and pathophysiology to formulate a field impression and implement a comprehensive treatment/disposition plan for patients with a wide range of medical issues. Pre-hospital stabilization of injuries and diseases of various anatomical systems are discussed. Prerequisite: PAR 120S with a grade of C or better.
