COURSE DESCRIPTION

Study and development of writing and reading skills in preparation for college level English courses. Students will practice the writing process to create multi-paragraph expository texts of a variety of purposes, including summary and responses to texts to demonstrate comprehension. NOTE: Credits earned in this course do not count toward graduation requirements, nor are they usually transferrable to other institutions. Prerequisite: Satisfactory assessment scores or ENG 085D. Prerequisite or corequisite: GEN 101S. Lab fee.
