- In order to graduate in two years after transfer, students must begin in the fall term. The fall semester is the time for them to complete all remaining pre-requisite classes needed such as ED 2100, ED 2650, ED 2800, EED 1000, EED 3400, and HED 3310. Students then apply to the Elementary Education cohort by September 15 and begin cohort classes in the spring semester of their junior year/year three.
- In addition to submitting the program application, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Elementary Education program:
  - Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
  - Grades of C or better and “P” for all pre-requisite ED/EDS/EED coursework and EED content courses
  - Passing scores in each of the following areas:
    - One of the following reading scores:
      - ACT reading score of 19 or better
      - SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
      - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
    - One of the following writing scores:
      - ACT writing score of 6 or better
      - SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
      - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
    - One of the following math scores:
      - ACT math score of 17 or better
      - SAT math score of 510 or better
      - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better
- Consult with your dedicated Wright State academic advisor about the program application process and deadlines.
- Students must be admitted to the university before the application for ED 2650 can be made. Application for ED 2650 Field Experience at Wright State is due January 15 of year two/sophomore year (while still studying at Edison State).
- 120 hours minimum are required for a BSED degree at Wright State.

## 1. ADMISSIONS AND DEADLINES

*Join the Wright Path Program*

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Students interested in applying to the Wright Path must submit a request for membership at [wright.edu/wrightpath/edison-state](http://wright.edu/wrightpath/edison-state).

High school students must have completed their junior year before applying to the Wright Path, and current Edison State students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

## ***Transfer to Wright State University***

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Edison State in order to transfer to Wright State.

Wright State processes applications as they are received. To help you make a smooth and timely transition, we recommend you submit your application by the following dates:

Fall Semester:	<b>April 1</b>
Spring Semester:	<b>October 15</b>
Summer Semester:	<b>February 1</b>

Students must apply for undergraduate admission one semester prior to completing their studies at Edison State.

Students must be admitted to the university before the application for ED 2650 can be made. Application for ED 2650 Field Experience at Wright State is due January 15 of year two/sophomore year (while still studying at Edison State).
